Performing Arts is an excellent preparation for employment in:

You could also seek employment in the performing arts and related industries such as theatre, film, television, community arts, arts management, broadcasting and journalism.

Students on the level 3 courses also have the opportunity to progress on to a higher education degree in any of the humanities subjects such as literature, languages, psychology, law, history, philosophy, art, social sciences, religion, music and teaching.

You could also progress on to a higher education degree in theatre, performance or training at a drama college (drama school)

Level 3 BTEC Certificate in Performing Arts (Dance)

Subjects studied

Entry requirements

This is a one year part time course that will develop your creativity and allow you to explore the potential for dance in performance.

The course is ideally suited to students who have an existing background in dance and who would like to pursue a career in choreography and/or dance performance, or those wishing to study dance further at a higher level

The course is equivalent to 1 AS-level and is awarded the equivalent UCAS points. You will study three units over the course of the year which will be delivered in two separate weekly sessions each lasting two hours. The sessions will be in the late afternoon or early evening.

You will study choreography, technique (contemporary and street) and, as well as studying performance, you will have the opportunity to take part in your own dance performances.

The course is delivered through seminars, workshops and practical sessions.

The sessions are mostly hands on and practical in nature with an emphasis on learning through doing.

Assessment for this course is carried out through performances, research, practical work, tutor observation and self evaluation.

- Previous dance experience
- Any level 2 qualification equivalent to 4 GCSE Grade A-C

You may be invited to attend an audition before being offered a place on this course.

Other opportunities

Students on the full time Level 3 Performing Arts courses are given the chance to attend a week long theatre residential in their first year of study.

The Performing Arts Centre has an extensive programme of live and filmed performances across the year. Students on the Performing Arts courses are often offered complimentary or discounted tickets for these shows.

Full-time students have an afternoon each week for a range of recreational activities and students are also encouraged to participate in the Students' Union.
