Childcare & Early Years

Purpose of the Course

We offer two qualifications in Childcare & Early Years dependent upon your starting points. Our Level 2 course is aimed at students who would like to work in any area of health, social care or early years. Our Level 3 Diploma in Childcare & Education (Early Years Educator) qualification enables you to gain the knowledge and experience to work with children from birth to five years, with knowledge of five to seven year olds.

Personal Development & Skills

This course will provide opportunities for you to go beyond purely academic theory, as there is a strong thread of personal and skills development embedded in your course allowing you to become reflective, independent participants, leaving the course with self-awareness and an ability to access and apply the knowledge you have gained in a variety of settings. In addition, you will participate in enrichment activities such as healthy cooking, basic car maintenance, communication skills and develop a deeper understanding of the society we live in by having the opportunity to explore and discuss current affairs.

Level 2 in Health and Social Care

Core units include:

Each unit has an assignment and most have some assessment related to practical placement. You will also complete a reflective study and one extended essay (externally set, externally marked). Two days a week are spent in real work environment placements so that a range of ages and settings are experienced. Staff arrange the placements for you.



Entry Criteria

Level 2: four GCSEs at grade D/3 or above, in a range of subjects preferably English language and maths or successful completion of a Level 1 qualification, or relevant experience for mature students.

Level 3: five GCSEs at grade C/4 or above in a range of subjects including English language and preferably maths, or a relevant Level 2 qualification at merit or above, or relevant experience for mature students.

Assessment Method

Level 2: externally assessed exams, leaflets, posters, role play, witness testimonies, observations, which will be assessed by your lecturers, internally verified and externally verified by the awarding organisation.

Level 3: written assignments for each mandatory unit, direct observation in the real work environment, plus 750 placement hours. Some assessments are set and marked by your lecturers, internally verified and then externally verified by the awarding organisation.

Progression Opportunities

To progress onto the Level 3 Diploma, you will need to have successfully completed your Level 2 programme at merit or distinction, English language at Level 2 and attained overall attendance greater than 88%. There are also opportunities to enter the early years sector, or progress onto an alternative Level 3 programme. On completion of the Level 3 Diploma you will be able to access higher education or enter the workforce as early years educators. Types of work settings include day nurseries, pre-schools and crèches. For students with some years of pre-school experience, work as a learning support assistant is possible.

Additional Learning Support

As part of your learning programme, if you have not yet attained a grade C/4 or equivalent in mathematics and English language, you will be required to study a Functional Skill or GCSE in these subjects.

Some students may require additional support for a number of reasons. At the start of your course you will be asked to complete an initial assessment in order for us to identify any additional needs that you may have. During your course, your personal tutor will be able to guide you on how best to access support.
