# Operate at the highest level

The Guernsey Apprenticeship offers you the opportunity to earn a salary and gain a nationally recognised technical, professional or vocational qualification in a job you love. You will need to have secured employment before applying or look at the 'Apprenticeship Vacancies' on our website.





This course is available to those recently appointed to an operative role within various industries on island, including construction site workers, road workers, waste and utilities operatives.

Working closely with employers, it allows you to learn, develop and practise the skills required for progression in the sector.



The time for completion of this course is 18 months.

You will attend College for one day a week for off-the-job training for the first year of study and then as the chosen pathway demands in the second year.



The majority of the off-the-job learning will take place at Coutanchez Campus, Guernsey College of Further Education, with the possibility of apprentices visiting specific venues for bespoke training as and when required.

# The onward journey

After successfully completing your apprenticeship and having gained further work experience within your role, you will be in a good position to progress into supervisory roles within the industry.





Apprenticeships are available to all. However, due to the nature of the work tasks involved in this apprenticeship, most apprentices will need to be over 18.

You will be assessed for suitability using a range of online tests with support and guidance offered where necessary.

If you have not achieved maths or English at D/3/Level 1, you will study these subjects to support progression and achievement of your chosen apprenticeship. Failure to complete maths and English will prevent progression between apprenticeship levels or achieving your overall apprenticeship.



The College's Student Support Services are available to provide support and help to make a success of your apprenticeship journey.

The College also works in partnership with Careers Guernsey whose advisors can support you in helping to choose the right next step for you and your future plans. They can support you in preparing for apprenticeship job interviews and any applications you may make.
